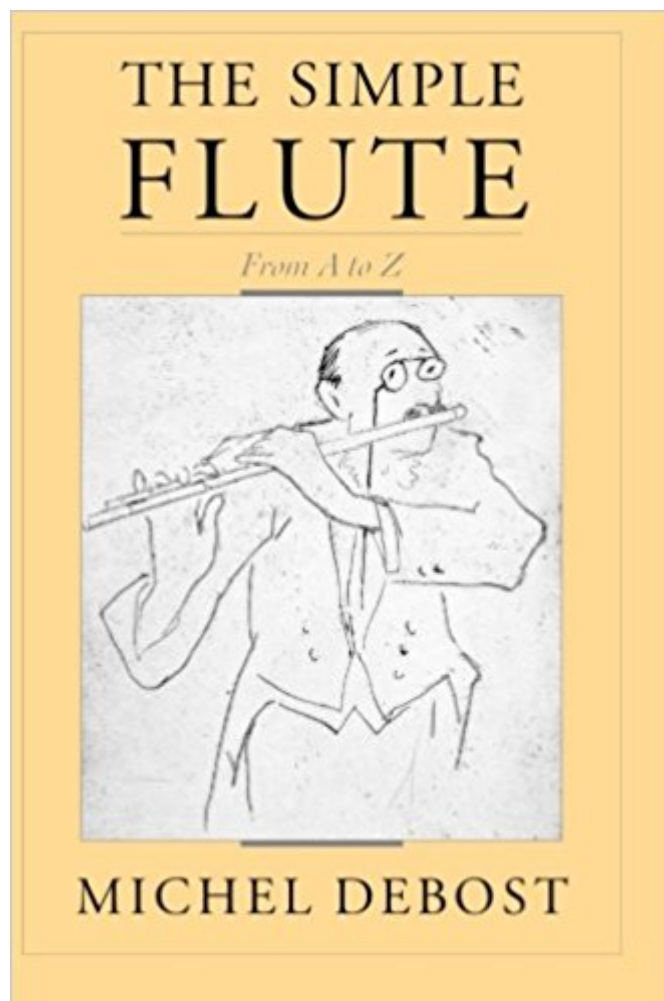


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The Simple Flute: From A To Z

In addition, the book includes original exercises such as "Debost's Scale Game," making it an excellent resource for flute teachers. Debost concludes each essay with "In a nutshell" and "Please refer to" boxes that make the book easy to browse, dog-ear, and return to again and again. Offering concise, common-sense solutions for flutists of all levels, this book is an ideal reference guide on flute performance.

Michel Debost is Professor of Flute at the Oberlin Conservatory. He succeeded Jean-Pierre Rampal at the Paris Conservatoire National and served as principal of the Orchestre de Paris under music directors Munch, Karajan, Solti, and Barenboim.

I began taking lessons on the flute as an adult a few years ago. I have worked with two different teachers and have also found a lot of help online and through books. This book is so excellent. In particular, Debost communicates his strong and clear sense of how the body relates to producing the tone of the flute.

Useful and wonderfully written, but alphabetical, so you probably won't want to read it from cover to cover.

This fabulous book is relatively easy to read. The style is conversational; you feel you're having a personal chat with a master. I totally agree with the core philosophy of the book: Enjoy what you do, don't hurt yourself doing it, and yes: proper practice will help you enjoy the flute even more.

Excellent reading. Lots of deep insights. Sometimes it does not seem like a book of music. The ideas are repeated again and again, which in the music field is alright.

I have gone through about 20 flute books in my quest for inspiration and tips about this wonderful instrument. This one is the best by far because Debost LOVES FLUTES, and he loves to play the

flute. He refers to the sound that comes out of the instrument (when played well) as a "sensual pleasure" for the player (and listeners). He thinks "No pain, no gain" is unrealistic, and that more comfort equals more pleasure. Good point! When it comes to the rules of fingering, he maintains that if it isn't the "correct" fingering but doesn't hurt the music, and feels better or makes it easier, one should go ahead and do it. The idea that sticks out most is that playing the flute should be fun and richly rewarding. The A-Z layout of the book is totally reader-friendly. One can look at the list of topics and easily find exactly what is desired. I love this book. :)

The message of this book is that flutists should trust themselves to do whatever works for them to transcend technique and get down to the business of making music. To that end, DeBost offers good, practical advice based on many years of experience. The book is fun to dip into at random or to read more seriously.

This book is DeBost's (successful) attempt at making the flute less complicated than we perceive it. Every serious flutist should read this book and take what works for them from it!!
