

KENN KAUFMAN, originator of the Kaufman Field Guide series, is one of the world's foremost naturalists.

This book was a bit of a disappointment as I was hoping it had maps of the range of a certain insect. It allows you to identify an insect but says little about its habits, food preferences. A lot of the data is grouped by family and only the scale of the pictures allows good identifications of closely resembled

family members. It's better than nothing but just barely.

Beautiful colored pictures to stimulate a person's interest in collecting insects! And the accompanying text tells us whether an insect is good or bad, so that we know whether we should kill it and add it physically to our collection, or to just "capture" it with our camera and put it into our photo album. This information is useful even to someone who is already into collecting insects.

I prefer this guide over the National Audubon Society Field Guide to Insects and Spiders. I have them both (1980 copyright of Audubon) but if I could have only one, it would be Kaufman since in many instances it has more pictures of specific groups than does Audubon. Syphidae: Kaufman, 40 vs Audubon, 6. Carabidae: Kaufman, 33 vs Audubon, 6. Coccinellidae: Kaufman, 43 vs Audubon 5. Moths and caterpillars as a group, Kaufman, nearly 300 vs Audubon, nearly 150. I suggest you compare the two books at a bookstore to see which fits your needs. Be sure to compare the INDEX of both books. I have not seen the newest edition of Audubon.

This is the best field guide available for the novice or experienced entomologist. The diversity of insects shown are beautifully illustrated and their identifications are accurate. The guide is very user-friendly with different easy ways to access insects by groups, common names, and scientific names. The descriptions, although brief, are very informative and highlight pertinent aspects of the insect groups or individual species being discussed. The authors are to be commended for producing the very first insect guide that enables an individual unfamiliar with entomology to rapidly get at least a good idea of the kind of insect he or she is trying to identify, and with so many common insects illustrated, a specific identification is possible in many cases.
