

Synopsis

The lighthouses of the five Great Lakes -- a comprehensive collection with full-color photographs. This comprehensive, full-color encyclopedia features more than 650 lighthouses located on all five of the Great Lakes. These lakes may appear easy to navigate, but swift currents, hidden reefs and shoals, shifting sandbars, uncharted passages and fierce, fast-moving storms made early navigation a mariner's nightmare. Thousands of sailors' lives were lost before the network of lighthouses was established, and tales of tragedy and triumph abound. All manner of stone, brick and wooden lighthouses were erected to light the night and guide the captains of schooners, steamers, brigs, barks and sloops. Too many of these noble structures have now fallen into disrepair or have been torn down in the name of progress, but hundreds survive as monuments to an exciting period in history and points of pilgrimage for millions of maritime enthusiasts. Great Lakes Lighthouses Encyclopedia includes lighthouses in both the United States and Canada. For each there is a description of its history and construction material. For many that are either open to the public or accessible through state or provincial parks, points of access are given.





Writer Patricia Wright and photographer Larry Wright collaborated on two previous books, *Bonfires and Beacons* and *Bright Lights, Dark Nights*.

I have a nice collection of books on lighthouses. Some are interesting, others are useful, but not all are as organized and attractive as this one. It only covers the lighthouses on the Great Lakes, not a small endeavor as there are 600 or more! The back cover of the books says "...more than 650..." but I only found 573 listed in the book. The book divides them by lake (Ontario, Erie, Michigan, Huron and Superior) and further by the country in which they are located (USA, all five lakes; or Canada, except Michigan which is entirely in USA). If you are interested in seeing photos of these lighthouses and learning history about them, this is an excellent book. If you plan to visit them, this book will help but you need more information to actually find some of them and to figure out if you can actually reach them. I recommend the website for Great Lakes Lighthouse Keepers Association (gllka.com), The US Lighthouse Society (uslhs.org), Lighthouse Friends (lighthousefriends.com) and US Lighthouses (us-lighthouses.com). When I go on lighthouse trips, I categorize their accessibility as follows:      Climb to top!     Enter!    Touch the outside!   See and photograph from a short distance (100 feet or less)!  See and photograph from a distance (more than 100 feet)! Keep in mind that many, many lighthouses no longer exist but, if you have good reference books (or the Internet), you can often find and visit their former locations!

Nice photos of the Lighthouses on the great lakes in the US & Canada. Very user friendly with Lighthouses listed by names/numbers on geographic maps. When possible the authors list names of

the lighthouse keepers with occasional firsthand accounts through logs/diaries/letters. They describe the physical and technical features of the lighthouses as well. Often brief accounts of the contractors involved are included with amounts funded/ funding sources.
