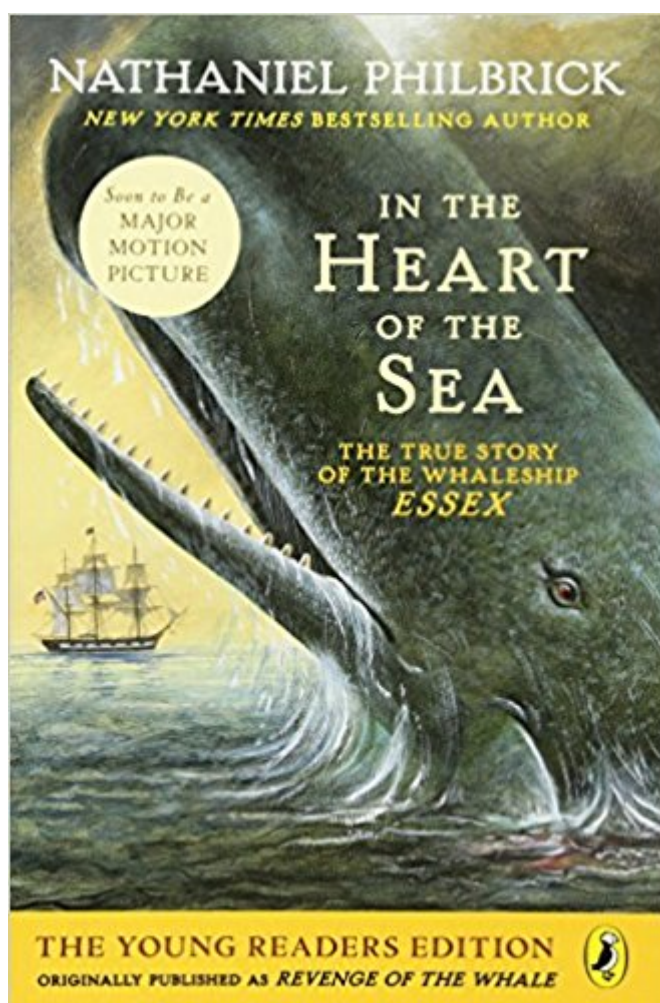

On November 20, 1820, the whaleship *Essex* was rammed and sunk by an angry whale. Three months later, two of the boats were rescued 4,500 miles away, off the coast of South America. Of the twenty-one castaways, only eight survived, including young Thomas.
