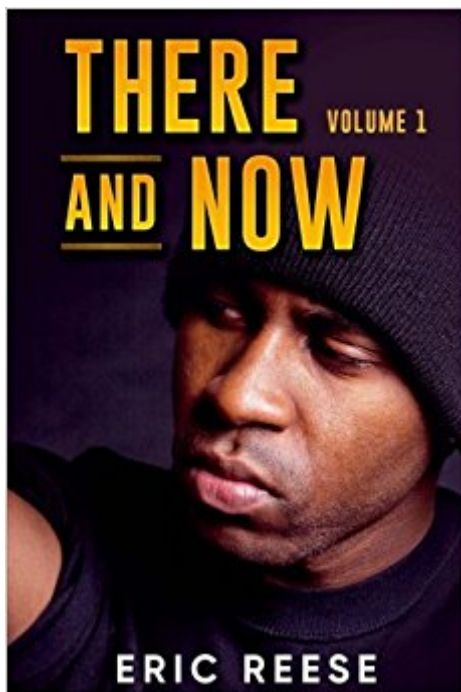

The 76-page introduction (first edition of 2016) to the life of the self-described "Lil E" is a tale of hope and discovery amid the turbulence of urban Philadelphia in the mid-1970s to mid-1980s on the surface. Nonetheless, the main character's voice reflects alienated attitudes and disconnected tones prevalent among today's young people from even suburban and rural backgrounds. The book is only an introduction. That is one reason the book will leave a reader hungry for more. Lil E grows up as a target for put-downs and shares a lot of hard feelings about how it feels to be berated and bullied. The story is laid out in a manner very similar to expressions from today's teens. The author disregards traditional paragraph structures and employs terse and seemingly rambling prose. I wondered whether those touches were innovation or accidental. By the end of the volume, I decided there is a keen insight and careful construction in the strong narrative. The writer builds a character with which readers will engage, from which they might gain insight into the mindsets of youths that feel alone and unloved. There and Now offers hope to young people who despair because of bullies, crime and the burdens of everyday life. through desegregation, and learning to fight back when he was bullied. Though its short, only about 60 or so pages, I found it to be a very enjoyable read. There were some parts I really related to, some parts that made me smile and some that made me sad, because I remember experiencing similar things growing up as being one of the only brown kids in an all white class (two of us were natives and one was black). Some of the references to pop culture in the 80s was especially enjoyable for me because I love movies and music that comes from that era, even though I was born in the early 90s. He spends a lot of time talking about girls, which originally kind of annoyed me, but thinking back to my own child and teenage years, I spent a lot of my time thinking about boys and girls too. I realized I was bisexual when I was in seventh or eighth grade, so I can't really blame the guy for admiring girls, since I did the same thing hah. My favorite part of the book was probably when he talks about his dog, Bubble Gum. It just made me smile. I only really have two criticisms, one being that the formatting is a little difficult to read for long periods of time because it runs on a little and I think it could use more paragraph breaks, and another being that there were a few spelling and grammar mistakes. But honestly, these are not things that effect the feel or soul of the book. Its still incredibly charming and a fun read. Overall, I really enjoyed this autobiography and I highly recommend it.
