

The book goes through basic elements of being a pack leader for your dog(s), in different families and stages of life. It's full of elaborating examples, and good basic data (and there are references for further reading at the end). However, I bought the book as I brought my new dog to knowledge myself with the how to questions of raising a dog. Though I feel I did get the basic principles, I feel I didn't get enough. The different chapters on different stages in life and different types of family are too short if you are in the need to learn about that situation, and too long if it's not that relevant to you, and probably anyone will find a lot of the latter kind of chapters. So - bottom line - a good book, but if you're on the look for a basic dog training and behavior book - I guess (without reading them) perhaps that other books, including Cesar's - are the more smart choice.

It is important to understand your reasons for getting a dog, which helps you then know how to choose a dog - or - helps you to know when it is not the right time. Dog ownership is a blessing and a big committment and I'm an advocate of this book because it lays out the big picture, the good and the bad. You would be wise to read this book before making a pet committment.

I have learned so much from this book! I just adopted a rescue dog and all of Cesar's suggestions are working! I just wish he would be more specific about some things...if he says he uses a treat, what does he use??? Other than that, the man is a genius, and my husband and I can't believe how totally different it is having a dog that knows we are above her in the pack! I adored my previous dog, bless her heart (she died a year ago) but I see now that SHE thought SHE was the pack leader, and it is our fault! In turn it caused her to have a lot of issues such as pulling like crazy on walks, etc.

Cesar's approach to dog ownership is so fundamental. Some of his tactics for introducing yourself to a dog can be challenging for a novice (like myself) but should at least be tried to establish the proper hierarchy in your family. While the human is at the top of the top of this heirarchy the dog's position in the family is very respected too. If more dog owners would give their pet's the proper

excercise (which is #1 in Ceasar's approach) many dog problems would be avoided. His focus is to keep dogs happy and well adjusted within a family. This should be a must read for any potential dog owner or current dog owner so that fewer dogs end up euthanized or in shelters due to incompatiblilty in their family. I also really respect Ceasar's information about adopting from a shelter or rescue group which is something more people should consider.

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
