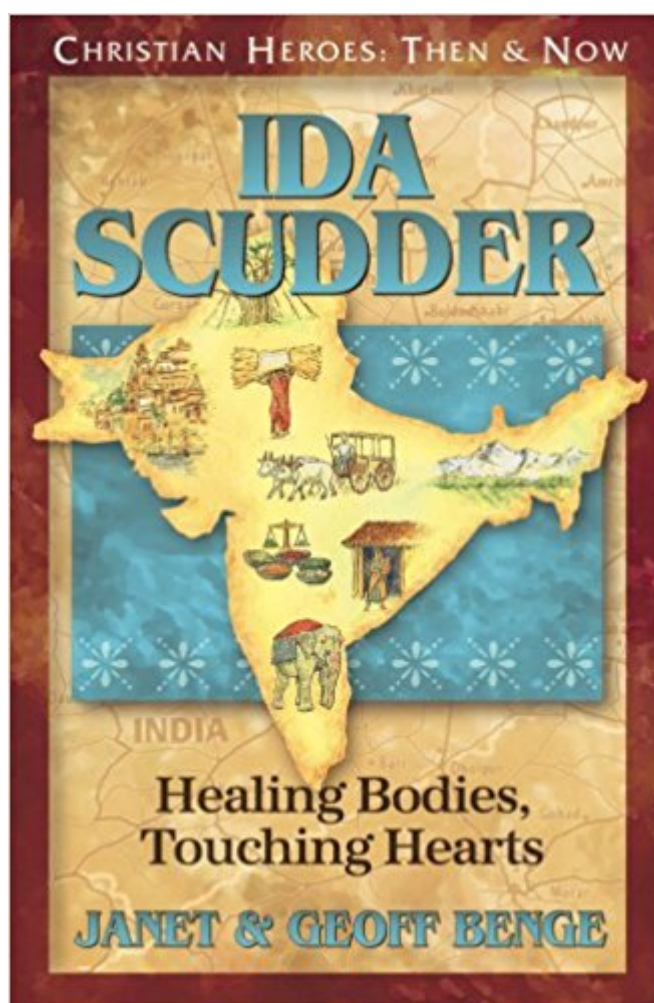

As a late teenager, she swore to her friends she would never become a missionary, but God changed that one night through a series of remarkable occurrences. She went on to become a doctor of medicine and spent the next 50 years healing the Indian people, starting several medical schools and educating the public regarding basic hygiene etc...

..... Know your facts. Count the cost. Money is not the important thing. What you are building is not a medical school. It is the Kingdom of God. Don't err on the side of being too small." Ida's words in her diary when faced with a challenge. Having been born to missionary parents in India, as a young girl, Ida was determined that she was not going to follow in her parent's footsteps. She was going to live 'the life' in the USA! Happenings that followed changed her mind. One evening three men in India visited her at separate times asking her to come help their wives who were having difficult childbirths. Due to the custom back then her father, the doctor, was not allowed to treat/help the woman. Ida was unqualified so all three women died! (Their husbands believed it was the will of Allah.) Devastated, Ida found herself praying to God, giving her life to India & helping the women.

Read this incredible story of how, after receiving her training she returned to India where over time she set up the most prestigious medical college for women in Vellore, helped thousands & thousands in roadside clinics & found herself the "mother" to many children. God's provision along with Ida's determination, hard work and faith are the reason that this incredible continues even to this day.
