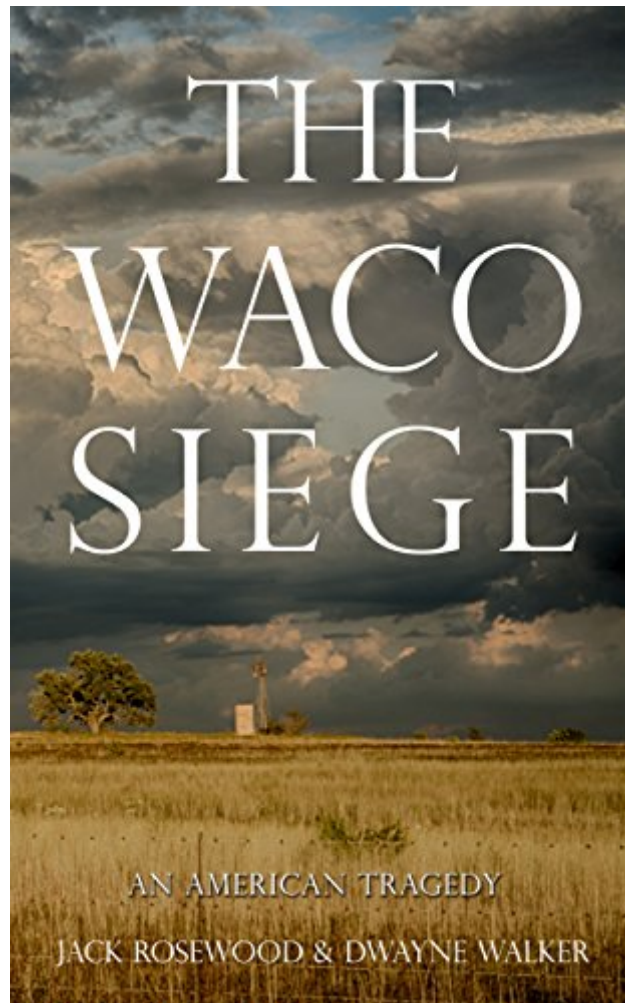

I'm giving this book four stars because I feel that it is an adequate introduction to the events at Waco. It is by no means comprehensive, and is rife with grammar errors, but as a starting point and priced at \$11 it's worth the read if you're interested in Waco. It's relatively short so it shouldn't take more than a couple of days for the dedicated reader. Along with this I'd recommend watching the Rules of Engagement documentary.

This is one of the best books I have read so far this year. It gives a highly unbiased and objective account of this grave tragedy that happened on American soil in 1993. I really like the lucid writing style of Jack Rosewood and how he gets to the point so quickly without any apparent loss of detail whatsoever. Living in Texas, with a son at Baylor university, I was very aware of the siege and was home at lunch watching the news and could not believe what I was seeing. There were many at that time, including me who thought it was unnecessary. This very competent review of facts along with other's show the reality of what happened.

Although relatively unbiased, this is only a very brief summary with limited insight into why the Waco siege unfolded the way it did. There seems to be very little by the way of primary sources

i.e.interviews with the people involved. It is also poorly edited (i.e. "martial law" is expressed as "marshal law".)

Florida author Jack Rosewood inherited his fascination for heinous crimes from his father, a journalist covering major grim crimes, e.g. Ted Bundy. He is fascinated with serial killers – their development psychologically, their preparation for their life of crime, and the details of how they made their bloody black marks on the world. The movie star handsome Rosewood lives in Jupiter, Florida with his wife and two children. This is now his third book co-authored by Dwayne Walker who has written a number of non-fiction books on Texas history, world history, the history of warfare, and now has conducted research and writing on the topic of terror and how it affects populations – the reason he joins Jack on the series on the criminally insane. But as is becoming the custom with Rosewood his comment at books end bring important aspects into focus: – the government, from President Bill Clinton down to ground level federal agents, can only blame themselves for allowing the plethora of conspiracy theories to proliferate in the years since

the Waco Siege. By not being more forthcoming initially, the average American has since viewed the congressional hearings of 1995 and 2000 as little more than kangaroo courts, which has given more credence to the conspiracy theorists. More government transparency in the weeks after the siege may have prevented this attitude from taking hold. Ultimately, when people ask if the tragedy of the Waco Siege could have been prevented the answer is not so simple. Yes, both sides made numerous mistakes along the way that aggravated the situation, but the essence of the situation "a breakaway sect in possession of an extremely large amount of guns" is something that is protected by the United States Constitution for the most part.
