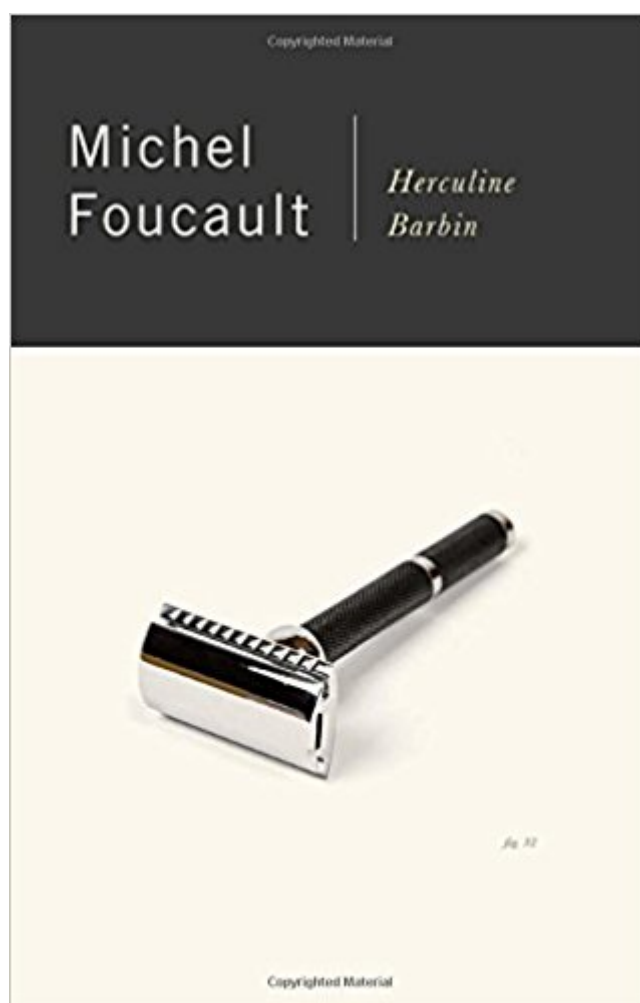

Synopsis

With an eye for the sensual bloom of young schoolgirls, and the torrid style of the romantic novels of her day, Herculine Barbin tells the story of her life as a hermaphrodite. Herculine was designated female at birth. A pious girl in a Catholic orphanage, a bewildered adolescent enchanted by the ripening bodies of her classmates, a passionate lover of another schoolmistress, she is suddenly reclassified as a man. Alone and desolate, he commits suicide at the age of thirty in a miserable attic in Paris. Here, in an erotic diary, is one lost voice from our sexual past. Provocative, articulate, eerily prescient as she imagines her corpse under the probing instruments of scientists, Herculine brings a disturbing perspective to our own notions of sexuality. Michel Foucault, who discovered these memoirs in the archives of the French Department of Public Hygiene, presents them with the graphic medical descriptions of Herculine's body before and after her death. In a striking contrast, a painfully confused young person and the doctors who examine her try to sort out the nature of masculine and feminine at the dawn of the age of modern sexuality.

I recommend this wholeheartedly for understanding intersexuality or just if you love tragic romance. Foucault's commentary is helpful and enjoyable. Herculine is such a fabulous storyteller and her story is so heartbreakingly tragic but it grounds the concept of intersexuality into reality rather than most lore written about hermaphrodites which, as Foucault said, reduces intersexuality to myth. It is interesting to compare Herculine's memoirs to the story about the "scandal at the convent". Sadly the later is divergent from truth in rather sexist and misleading ways. For instance, the author rewrites Herculine as being far more stereotypically masculine than she was and writes her lover as far more stereotypically feminine than her memoirs describe Sara. The masculine stereotype is devilishly unappealing looks with a vast intellect and the feminine stereotype is physical perfection and emptiheadedness. It is in some ways an enjoyably dynamic contrast, but cliché, though I'm sure some would think it more romantic that way. Some of the medical journals seemed a bit Freudian and Foucault talks about the misogynistic history of such literature, but they were interesting.

A very moving account. Foucault simply frames it, but it is a lovely and sad book.
