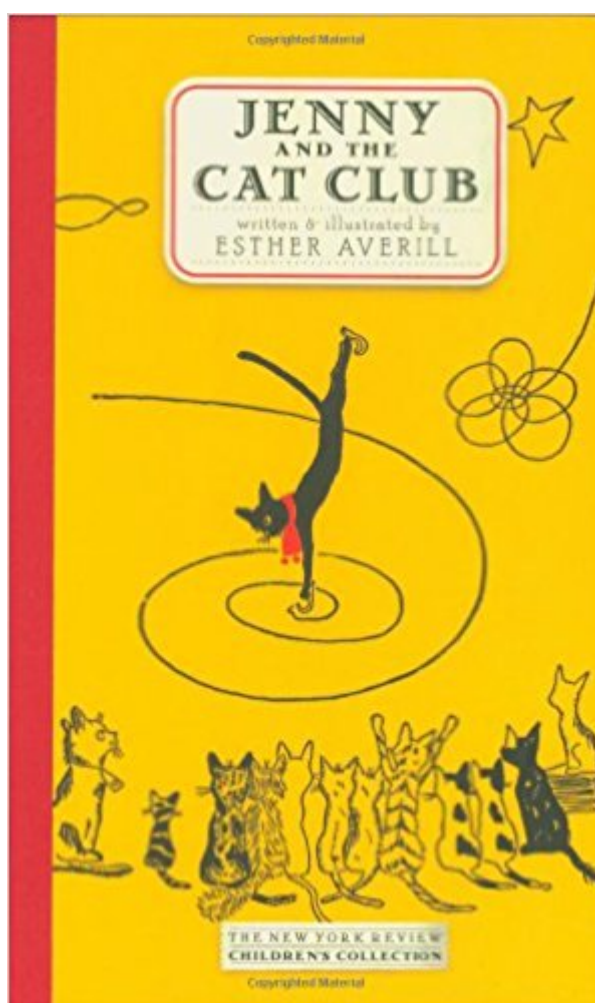

There is a way to write, that is simple, yet not condescending. An economy of words that wraps up emotions, actions and adventures with charm and wit while being appropriate for the young and entertaining even for older readers. Knowing this, it's easy and always exciting to come across a classic book. This book IS a classic and I'd never heard of it until this year. I knew it as soon as I opened it and read the first bit, then watched my 7 year old daughter glow about it. We're a homeschooling family and so we buy a lot of books (our local library is dismal, living in a very rural area) to keep our children reading and interested. The whole New York Times review of books is a treasure trove for us that we're excited to explore. In these times we find that reading for the young has become one poor, grouchy, rude, second rate Scholastic book after another, so we search pretty rigorously for books just like this. Our 7 year old, found these a bit below her reading level, but it doesn't change the fact that she loved to read them, they made a reading experience that she'll remember, that was positive, and that's what it's all about. There are no one star reviews for a reason, buy this book.

Our four year old son adores this book -- and now all the Cat Club series. Jenny is shy but brave, curious but caring, providing great starting points for conversations about friendship, family and facing challenges. We read this as a bedtime book and it's a favorite choice. In the six months that we've owned it, we've read it in full at least 20 times.

I have purchased many copies of this book. We first discovered it at the library when my daughters were young (mid 80's) and read every book in the series. I was delighted to see they have been reissued and have purchased every one for my own library. I read Jenny and the Cat Club every year to my first graders, and I have frequently purchased it to give as a gift to volunteers who have helped in my classroom (so they can read it to their children :)). The stories are delightful and imaginative, but I especially love them because Jenny displays such outstanding character. She's not perfect but in the long run she always chooses to do what is right.

This little children's book is delightful. I remember getting it from the Library's Bookmobile when I was a child. I am now 64 and am enjoying reading it to my granddaughters. The personality of Jenny the cat and her friends in the Cat Club is well explored by the author and allows children to relate to emotions like shyness, fear of rejection, pride of accomplishment, etc. The book is mainly text with a few illustrations in each story. If a child were to be reading this for his/her self, they would probably need to be at a second grade level to be comfortable reading it alone.

I first read the Jenny Linsky books when I was a very small child, and loved them so much that when I was allowed to get a kitten of my own, I chose a little black one, just like Jenny Linsky. These books became part of my childhood memories-when the cats were out, my mother would say they "were at a cat club meeting". I would imagine them dancing the sailor's hornpipe, one playing the nose flute as accompaniment. The influence of the Jenny Linsky books stayed with me, and because of them, I have always had black cats, and learned how special they are. The stories in "Jenny and the Cat Club" are as enchanting as I remember, the illustrations wonderful. Today the stories might be considered "tame" in comparison with our animated space going super hero fascination, but they still have great power to charm a young child's imaginings, and an old lady's memories. Highly recommended!.

This is a collection of Jenny Linsky stories. If you only get one Jenny book, this should be it.

I bought this book for a west coast granddaughter, after being given a copy to read to my east coast

grandchildren. The stories are charming, and will be appreciated by cat lovers and non-cat lovers alike. This book makes a good transition from picture books (with little story-line) to a book that early readers can follow. Parents (and grandparents) will enjoy having a real piece of fiction to read to the kids, as well as, the simple illustrations that younger kids will be able to apply their growing imaginations to. I am glad that this book has been reprinted and is now available for modern audiences that are, too often, 'dumbed downed' with overly cute pictures and moralistic stories.
