

Focuses on ASPAN's full scope of perianesthesia nursing practice regardless of the practice setting. Provides the core content necessary to demonstrate competency as a perianesthesia nurse. Includes a section on LifeSpan Considerations, Unit 3, to help the nurse understand the full scope of perianesthesia care from pediatrics through older adult life. Unit 4, Competency of Preoperative Assessment incorporates all aspects of the complete assessment of the patient and family including key areas such as cultural and alternative/complementary therapies. Unit 6, Surgical Specialties provides a consistent format presentation for each specialty area, including anatomy and physiology, pathophysiology, operative procedures, postanesthesia priorities: phases 1, 2, and 3, and where necessary, potential complications including anesthesia and pain management. An appendix on Certification Concepts and Testing Strategies along with the core content provides an outstanding tool to prepare for certification as a perianesthesia nurse (CPAN) or as an ambulatory perianesthesia nurse (CAPA).
