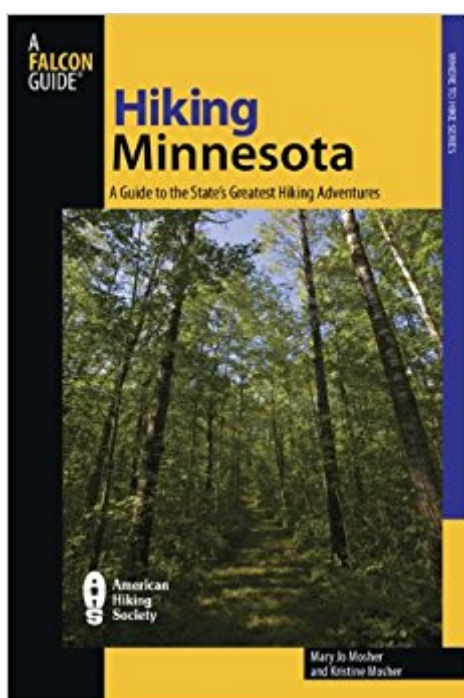


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Hiking Minnesota, 2nd: A Guide To The State's Greatest Hiking Adventures (State Hiking Guides Series)

I just really started wanting to get outdoors again as an adult. I loved the outdoors as a kid and I want my daughter to enjoy Minnesota as much as I did. My mom and I went to Itasca State Park and hiked the trail that was marked in the book. Some of the trail was more primitive giving us a good view of the lakes and different wildlife in the area. The book is easy to use and very helpful will directions and what is in the surrounding areas. I also like the way they rank the trails from easy to difficult.

I own dozens of hiking guides, and this is by far the least useful. It has virtually no information about trails in Minnesota's vast national and state forests. Instead it is little more than a list of state parks, and that information is easily obtained at no cost - they give you a map and trail guide when you enter a state park. And the information is already outdated; I tried to hike one of the very few state forest trails mentioned in this book, and the trail was nothing like the book described it; it had been heavily logged (looked as if a bomb had gone off), ran into some overgrown ATV trails and simply ended only a short distance from the trailhead. "Hiking North Carolina" is an example of a great hiking guide, with maps and information on hundreds of trails, many of them in national forests instead of just lazily cherry-picking the state parks. Minnesota deserves a thorough trail guide including of course the North Country Trail; this is a near-worthless substitute.

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
