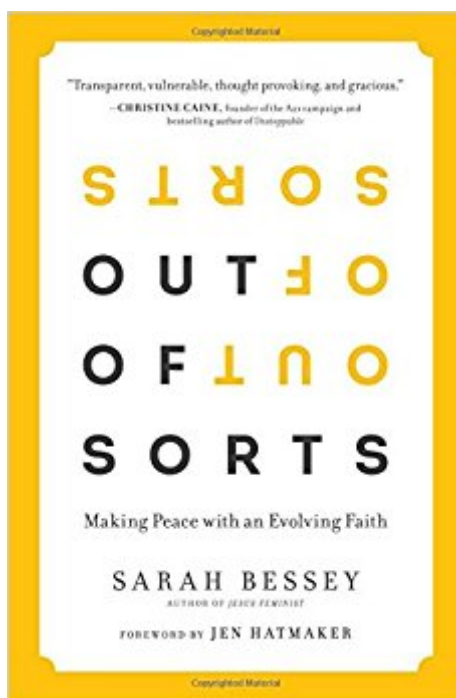

I've soaked up Sarah's beautiful words through her blog for quite a while now and was eager to read her newest book, *Out of Sorts*. I had no idea what a gift this book would be.
